- Include as your first slide a title slide that clearly states: your name, your organisational affiliations and your presentation title.
- 8mins presentation + 2mins questions.
- PowerPoint slides should be in widescreen 16:9 format. This is essential for optimal viewing.
- Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
- You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly.
- N.B. there is NO poster component of this presentation.
- Use a symbol on your presentation to indicate whether or not it may be Tweeted about.

On the day, Thursday 9 November 2023:

- We will have approximately 10 participants in each Science Bites session. It is of utmost importance that each person present their talk strictly within the 3 min timeframe: please prepare your slides accordingly, as below.
- Include as your first slide a title slide that clearly states: your name, your organisational affiliations and your presentation title.
- 3 minutes maximum for the presentation with 1 MINUTE FOR QUESTIONS
- PowerPoint slides should be in widescreen 16:9 format. This is essential for optimal viewing.
- Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
- Absolutely no animations. No acknowledgement slide is to be presented.
- Up to 3 data slides only. The title slide, described above, is extra, for a total of 4 slides.
- You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly.
- N.B. there is NO poster component of this presentation.
- Use a symbol on your presentation to indicate whether or not it may be Tweeted about.

- Or, tell us if you can no longer present: If you are no longer able to present, please alert us at info@viin.org.au so we can allocate your place to another presenter. There is a wait-list of people wanting to present.
- Tell us your availability: Note that you should please plan to attend the entire Symposium. There will be two poster sessions: one at lunch time (approximately 12.30pm to 1.30pm, time to be confirmed) and one in the evening (approximately 5pm to 6pm, time to be confirmed). If there are extremely important reasons as to why you may not be able to attend part of the Symposium, you must email us by this date to tell us your availability for the day. We will do our best to accommodate your schedule, but cannot guarantee allocating you to a specific timeslot in the program.

Preparing your poster

- Maximum poster size is A0. Poster display space is limited if your poster does not adhere to these size
 restrictions there may not be room to display it. Prepare your poster in PORTRAIT orientation.
- We also request that you **prepare a spiel of no more than a minute** with which to present your poster to the judges during your session as they will each have a number of posters to assess and only limited time.
- Include your name, your organisational affiliations and your poster title. Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
- You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly.
- Use a symbol on your presentation to indicate whether or not it may be Tweeted about.

On the day, Thursday 9 November 2023:

- We will have approximately 35 participants in each poster session (one during lunchtime and one in the evening, as noted above).
- Lunchtime poster session presenters should:
 - Hang their posters on arrival
 - Remove their posters promptly at the conclusion of lunch
- Evening poster session presenters should:
 - Hang their posters at the afternoon tea break
 - o Remove their posters promptly at the conclusion of the evening poster session
- Please check the program carefully as to which session you are scheduled to present in.
- Velcro dots will be supplied by VIIN to allow you to adhere your poster to the poster board.
- Poster prize judges will be visiting posters and expecting to speak to presenters during their poster session.
 Please be present at your poster for at least the first 45 minutes of each poster session, both for delegates wishing to speak to you about your work and for judges. Consider asking a friend to bring you catering at your poster.
- Storage for posters will be available. The specific location for storage will be provided closer to the date of the symposium.
- Verbally remind delegates of your wishes about whether your presentation may be Tweeted about when you give your talk or deliver your spiel in front of your poster.
